

Born in Detroit, trained in New York at the Juilliard School, Vendetta Mathea is an American choreographer living in France where she has converted an abandoned umbrella factory built in 1898 into a major dance hub for students, researchers, dancers and choreographers.

In 1971, she begins her career as a performer with the Walter Nicks Dance Company for the American Dance Festival at Connecticut College.

For ten years she works with many renowned New York choreographers. The solo by Vendetta Mathea - very, very good indeed, the kind of material that

La Manufacture is one of a kind, housing **dance training programs** and **residencies for professional artists**, developing effective links between **dance education** and **professional productions**.

Students and artists are strongly and permanently connected with the expertise of a **vibrant faculty**, all working professional with great international experience.

The goal is not to become a framed dancer, a role model. It is to become ourselves. Someone in fusion with our body and mind, not just living inside of them but feeling clearly the way movement speaks.

Among the tools, made efficient with persevering work and personal attention, there are the emotions. Emotions are our greatest gift. They connect us to the past, the present and the future. They give us the possibility to understand the deepness of our souls to be a strong and sensitive artist on stage.




La Manufacture's programs offer **students 18 and over** an opportunity to **study dance in Aurillac**, a town located **in the heart of France** in a natural reserve, one hour flight from Paris. We provide programs for students who wish to pursue a professional career in dance and for those who love dance.

Programs vary in length and structure in order to **meet the individual needs** and objectives of every student. They are designed to develop **personality**, **versatility**, **artistry**, and **strong technical skills**.

La Manufacture dance education programs and artists residencies are housed at **La Manufacture Studios**, **Le Theatre** and **Le Parapluie**, all with state-of-theart sound, light, photo and video equipment including one of the first **full LED lighting system** in the world.

The Dance Campus hosts **seven dance studios** including **two performing theater studios** at La Manufacture Studios seating up to 300. Le Theatre with its **dance stage** seats 350 and Le Parapluie with its **open stage** up to 500.







La Manufacture's **Incubating Programs** take a unique approach to training by offering classes and workshops in diverse **dance techniques and in an environment of professional productions**.

La Manufacture promotes a liberal teaching that provides the **humanistic**, **ethical**, **social** and **critical background** essential to **personal development** and **professional excellence**.

Students gain valuable performing experience through studio performances, internships with professional artists in residence, participations at our weekly Wednesdays public encounters and at our five annual major dance events.

Students take classes from the core dance curriculum that includes contemporary dance, modern, jazz, ballet, dance contact, composition, improvisation, barre à terre, yoga, theater, voice, kinesiology and body conditioning classes.

Curriculum also includes anatomy, physiology, dance history, art history, performing arts economy, lights & sound technical classes and, of course, our every day French classes.

Among other programs, students may choose Fall | Spring Semester Programs or 4-Week Summer | Winter Intensive Workshops as well as our Certificate and Independent Study Programs.
