Vendetta Mathea the choreographer



A dancer, choreographer, teacher and visual artist, Vendetta Mathea was trained by the great masters of dance, who taught her their techniques (Graham, Limon, Dunham, ...).

Having moved to New York, she toured with major companies and with Walter Nicks from 1971. Vendetta Mathea performed her own solo pieces for several seasons from 1979. In 1983, at the height of the contemporary movement, she set up the Compagnie Vendetta Mathea in France.

Among her many experiences, Vendetta Mathea spent three years from 1993 to 1995 researching the theme "Gestural modernity and Musical tradition" with the help of fifty dancers, singers, musicians and visual artists of all kinds. This led to the creation of three pieces. "When a new, magnificent, powerful essence springs up from the interwoven roots of music and dance from here and elsewhere, 'Colors de Vida' crystallises an unprecedented revelation." - 1994 - Christine Lebas.

She has written some fifty pieces. After a 30-year career and thousands of performances all over the world, Vendetta Mathea presented "Women" in New-York in 2004, a production described in the Encarta encyclopaedia as one of the great dates in modern dance.

Her latest piece is "Homme | Animal" created in Paris in January 2010. "... a quality of writing and a refinement in the dance ... It's a style. A style made up of fluidity and superb work especially on the relationship with weight ... Something very personal, original and very precious." Since 1992, Vendetta Mathea has directed La Manufacture in Aurillac, a derelict industrial site built in 1898 and covering 1,300 m², which is now a centre for training, creation, production and performance totally dedicated to dance, movement and images.



Vendetta Mathea & Co the company

Founded in 1983, the company moved to Aurillac (France) in 1985, to what was then a National Theatre. Its repertoire included a number of pieces by Vendetta Mathea, including "Lobo", "Hélios", "Art Gallery", "Not For Kids Only", "Colors de Vida", "Flowing Waters", "Distant Dreams", etc., which were first performed in France (Nice, Monaco, Avignon, Aurillac), the United States (New York, Detroit, Newark) and China (Qingdao).

After the in-depth work done on the theme of "Gestural modernity and Musical tradition", the Company moved into a period of research entitled "Work in Progress" from 1996 to 2000, which involved residence and creation work, the production of small-scale performances and collaboration with artistes from different cultures, from China, the United States, India and elsewhere.


In 2001, Vendetta Mathea began a new, long-term project that led to the presentation of a number of phases in the extension of her personal reflection on human nature.

In 2004, the Compagnie Vendetta Mathea performed the production "Women", to a score by musician Bill Kleinsmith.

Having changed its name to Vendetta Mathea & Co in 2007, the company presented "Quand j'étais humain" at Aurillac Theatre (a public-funded theatre) in June 2008. "...Vendetta Mathea's choreography in "Quand j'étais humain" expresses the interior nature of being. Every movement is justified; its sensitive content reaches out to




the audience and remains compatible with virtuosity. Movement is spontaneous and technically superb, the references are there, the roots and sources create an authentic, profound, very pure style. We are moved by a dance that is formal, concentrated, enthusiastic and dazzling. A broad range of expression sways between rigour and freedom. 
> This production was mounted as part of a residence at La Manufacture, presented at the 2009 Avignon Festival and performed in Paris in January 2010. It examines the foundations of human nature, the study of which has always been part of choreographer Vendetta Mathea's life, even outside her artistic creation. She uses virtuoso dancers who have been working with her for a number of years.



The sound track evokes the elements and takes its inspiration from the five continents. The lighting provides an evocative harmony with no technical concessions, and finds solutions to the problems caused by the portability of the pieces.

HOMME | ANIMAL: THE ROAD TO OUR NATURE

'I'm blind, living in the dark, Darkness is my education. Education of family. I'm blind. Education of religion. I'm blind. Education of culture. I'm blind. How can I know who I am. 




